

## **Janet DeCesaris**

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### **Curriculum vitae**

**Janet DeCesaris** teaches Spanish-English and Catalan-English translation at Pompeu Fabra University in Barcelona, Spain, where she has been on the faculty since 1993. She has degrees in Spanish and Linguistics from Georgetown University and Indiana University (Ph.D., 1988).

Early in her career, she worked mainly on Spanish and Catalan phonology and morphology, and also worked as a professional translator in Barcelona.

After she joined Pompeu Fabra University, she became interested in sense differentiation in monolingual and bilingual dictionaries, and the relationship between dictionary representation and lexical structure.

She is a founding member of the University Institute for Applied Linguistics at Pompeu Fabra University.

She is the author of several articles on dictionaries, and her book, *Investigación de gramática* (co-author Patricia V. Lunn, published by Heinle&Heinle (Boston), 1992, 2nd ed., 2007) is widely used in American universities in the training of future Spanish teachers.

She is an active member of both the Dictionary Society of North America (DSNA) and the European Association for Lexicography (EURALEX).

She organized the 2008 EURALEX congress in Barcelona, and is currently President of EURALEX (2012-2014).
